KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE SOLOMONS DISEASES OF ANIMALS
REGULATION 1915.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's Acting High Commissioner
for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the
Pacific Order in Council, 1893.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the
Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great
Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions
beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith,
Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Solomons Diseases of Animals (Amendment) Regulation 1916. SHORT TITLE.

2. Section thirty-one of the Solomons Diseases of Animals Regulation 1915 is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:— NEW SECTION IN PLACE OF SECTION 31 OF KING'S REGULATION 10 OF 1915.

“ 31. It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner
“ to bring this Regulation into force either in whole
“ or in part by Proclamation in the *Western Pacific*
“ *High Commission Gazette*, and the Regulation, or
“ such part thereof as is referred to in any such Pro-
“ clamation, shall come into force on such date as the
“ High Commissioner shall in such Proclamation direct
“ and appoint.” “ COMMENCE-
MENT OF
REGULATION.”
