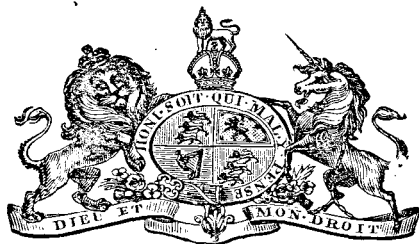

## KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND REGULATION No. V. OF 1905.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Solomons Fisheries Short title.  
(Explosives Amendment) Regulation, 1911.

2. The definition of "public fishery" in section two, and the words "in any public fishery" in section three, of the Solomon Islands Fisheries (Explosives) Regulation, 1905, are hereby repealed. Repeal of definition of "public fishery" &c. in Regulation No. V. of 1905.

Repeal of section 4  
of No. V. of 1905  
and provisions  
substituted.

3. Section four of the Solomon Islands Fisheries (Explosives) Regulation, 1905, is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

“ 4. Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds, or, at the discretion of the Court, to a term of imprisonment with hard labour not exceeding six weeks.”
