AN ORDINANCE

To Amend the Law Relating to Aliens.

[RESERVED 28TH JULY, 1922.

ASSENTED TO 20TH DECEMBER, 1922.]^(a)

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Aliens Ordinance, 1922.* Short title.

2. This Ordinance shall commence and take effect on the day on which the *Nationality Act, 1920*, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth shall by any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth be extended with or without amendment to the Territory. Commencement.

Repeal,
exceptions and
saving.

3. The *Aliens Ordinance, 1911-1919*, except Sections one and three thereof are repealed but such repeal shall not affect the rights or status of any person naturalized under that Ordinance.

Passed in Council this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

Assented to by His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the Twentieth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.
