AN ORDINANCE

To Grant and Apply a Sum out of the Revenues of the Territory to the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

BE it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Territory of Papua, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Papua Act, 1905-1924*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Appropriation Ordinance, 1934-1935*. Short title.

2. The Treasurer may issue out of the Revenues of the Territory and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, the sum of One Hundred and Thirty-two Thousand Five Hundred and Thirty-seven Pounds. Issue and application, £132,537.

3. For the purposes and services expressed in the First Schedule hereto the sum of One Hundred and Sixteen Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-one Pounds is appro- Appropriation of supplies, £116,931.

riated and shall be deemed to be appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, in addition to the sums amounting to Three Thousand Four Hundred and Sixty-five pounds appropriated by the *Papua Act, 1905-1924*, and in addition to the amount of the deficiency in the Superannuation Fund Account appropriated by the *Superannuation Ordinance, 1917-1933*, which amounts to the sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred and Six Pounds and in addition to the sum of Seven Thousand Six Hundred and Thirty-five Pounds being the unexpended portion of the amount appropriated by the *Copra Producers Assistance Ordinance, 1934*.

Advances for purposes of the Second Schedule.

4. In addition to the sum specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance the Treasurer may issue and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, as advances for the purposes set forth in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance any sum or sums not exceeding the aggregate sum appearing in the said Second Schedule.

Passed in Council this sixteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.
