AN ORDINANCE

To Amend the "Liquor Ordinance, 1911-1935."

BE it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Territory of Papua, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Papua Act, 1905-1934*, as follows:—

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance, 1940*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Liquor Ordinance, 1911-1935*, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3) The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance, 1911-1940*.

2. This Ordinance shall commence on the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one. Commencement.

3. Subsection (2) of Section Fourteen of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the words "in a town shall be Thirty pounds" and inserting the following words in their stead "in the town of Port Moresby shall be One hundred pounds and in any other town Thirty pounds."

4. Section Twenty of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting therein immediately after the word "necessary" first occurring the words "at least one dining-room of adequate size and".

5. The Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting immediately after Section Fifty-five A thereof the following new sections:—

Dining-room
on licensed
premises.

"55B. (1) Every publican shall provide and maintain upon his licensed premises an adequate dining-room equipped with appliances requisite for serving meals to guests.

(2) Any publican failing to observe the provisions of Subsection (1) of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds for each offence.

55C. (1) Every publican shall cause meals to be prepared cooked and served upon his licensed premises for any person requiring the same within the hours set forth in the Thirteenth Schedule to this Ordinance and upon payment of a reasonable sum.

(2) Any publican who without reasonable excuse proof whereof shall lie upon him fails to comply with the provisions of Subsection (1) of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each such offence.

55D. Any person who after having been supplied with any meal by a publican on licensed premises in accordance with the provisions of the preceding section of this Ordinance fails without reasonable excuse proof whereof shall lie upon him to pay for the same shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and in

default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding one month.

55E. Any person who having been supplied by a publican with accommodation on licensed premises fails without reasonable excuse proof whereof shall lie upon him to pay for the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding one month.”

Failure to pay for accommodation an offence.

6. The Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the following new Schedule:—

“THIRTEENTH SCHEDULE.

Section 55C.

USUAL MEAL HOURS.

Breakfast	7.30 a.m. to 9 a.m.
Lunch 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.
Dinner	6.30 p.m. to 8 p.m.”
