AN ORDINANCE

To Repeal the "War Precautions Ordinance, 1915-1916,"
and the "Trading With The Enemy Ordinance, 1916,"
and for other Purposes.

[RESERVED 28TH JULY, 1922.

ASSENTED TO 20TH DECEMBER, 1922.]^(a)

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *War Measures* Short title.
Repeal Ordinance, 1922.

2. The *War Precautions Ordinance, 1915-1916*, and the *Trading With The Enemy Ordinance, 1916*, are hereby re-
pealed. ^{Repeal.}

War Measures Repeal Ordinance, 1922.

Regulations.

3. (1) The Lieutenant-Governor may make regulations prohibiting or regulating the use of the word "Anzac" or any word resembling the word "Anzac."

(2) Such regulations may provide penalties not exceeding a fine of One hundred pounds or imprisonment with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding Six months or both such fine and imprisonment for breaches thereof.

Passed in Council this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

Assented to by His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the Twentieth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.
