

# STATUTORY RULES.

## No. 2 of 1921.

### REGULATIONS.

Made under the *Native Labour Ordinance*, 1911-1918.

Regulation No. 19 of the Regulations made under the *Native Labour Ordinance*, 1911-1912, on the twenty-third day of January, 1914, is repealed, as from the first day of January, 1921, and the following Regulation is inserted in its stead:—

“ 19 (1) The employer of a native who is admitted into a Government native hospital for the purpose of treatment, other than for venereal disease or sickness contracted during the time he was a deserter from his employer's service, shall pay hospital fees at the following rates:—

(a) If the native is an in-patient of the hospital, One shilling and six pence a day or portion of a day from the time of his admission;

(b) if the native is an out-patient of the hospital, One shilling and six pence for each attendance.

(2) The fees shall be payable to the Treasurer not later than fourteen days after the discharge of the native, if an in-patient, or after the last attendance upon him, if an out-patient.

(3) This Regulation shall commence and take effect on the first day of January, 1921.”
