

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 9 of 1925.

Made under the *Port Moresby Electric Light and Power Ordinance, 1925.*

The *Electricity Regulations, 1925* (Statutory Rules No. 3 of 1925), are amended by inserting after Regulation 56 the following new Regulations:—

“57. The Electric Authority may make electrical installations in any premises on behalf of the owner or of the tenant or occupier with the owners consent under the following conditions:—

- (1) When there is no person capable of undertaking and willing to undertake electrical installations ; or
- (2) where there is unreasonable delay on the part of any person who has undertaken to make electrical installations in making such installations ; or
- (3) where the charges demanded by any person for making electrical installations are shown to be unreasonable.

58. The charges for electrical installations by the Electric Authority shall be such as mutually agreed upon between the Electric Authority and the owner of the premises or the tenant or occupier thereof.”
