TEXT OF PROCLAMATION.

[Proclamation dated 12th January, 1951, and published in Papua and New Guinea Govt. Gaz. of 25th January, 1951.]

PROCLAMATION.

Quarantine Ordinance 1931-1938 of the Territory of New Guinea.

REMOVAL OF ANIMALS PROHIBITION.

WHEREAS by section 14 of the *Quarantine Ordinance* 1931-1938 of the Territory of New Guinea, it is amongst other things provided that the Administrator by Proclamation in the *New Guinea Gazette* may prohibit the removal of any animal from any part of the Territory to any other part of the Territory subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas by the provisions of the *Ordinances Interpretation Ordinance* 1949, any reference in an Ordinance of the Territory of New Guinea to the Administrator shall be read as a reference to the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea and any reference to the *New Guinea Gazette* shall be read as a reference to the *Government Gazette* of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to prohibit the removal of animals from any part of the Territory to any other part of the Territory except under certain conditions:

Now therefore, I, Jack Keith Murray, the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Quarantine Ordinance* 1931-1938 of the Territory of New Guinea and all other powers me enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that on and after the first day of March, 1951, the removal of any animal from any part of the Territory to any other part of the Territory shall be and is hereby prohibited unless the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto are first complied with provided that nothing in the Proclamation or the Schedule hereto shall prohibit the removal of any animals which at all times during and after such removal remain on the land of the owner of such animal or on land in which he has a legal or equitable right title or interest.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. No animal shall be removed from one place in the Territory of New Guinea to another place in the Territory of New Guinea unless a permit in writing for such removal be first given to the owner of such animal or his agent by the Chief Quarantine Officer (Animals) or by a Quarantine Officer (Animals) appointed under the *Quarantine Ordinance* 1931-1938:

Provided that the Chief Quarantine Officer (Animals) may by notice⁽¹⁾ in the *Gazette* grant general permission for the removal of any particular class of stock, including birds and bees, within such areas as are specified in such notice:

And provided further that such general permission referred to in the last preceding paragraph may by notice in the said *Gazette* be cancelled or varied in any respect by the said Chief Quarantine Officer (Animals), either with or without previous notice of his intention so to do.

2. Such permit may specify a particular route on which any such animal shall be removed and shall specify a commencing date for such removal and shall be in the following form:—

“Quarantine Ordinance 1931-1938.

PERMIT FOR REMOVAL OF ANIMALS.

Permission is hereby given to the person named herein in the Territory of New Guinea to move the animals described herein in accordance with the conditions set out below:—

This permission is given subject to the above conditions and shall be automatically cancelled unless those conditions are complied with.

3. Before a permit under these Conditions is given the owner of any animal sought to be removed or his agent shall make application in writing for such permit, such application to reach the appropriate authority at least six weeks prior to the date on which the movement of such animal is desired to commence.

4. Such application in writing shall be made to the Registrar of the Division of Animal Industry of the Department of Agriculture, Stock and Fisheries at Port Moresby in the Territory of Papua or to a Quarantine Officer (Animals) appointed as aforesaid.

5. The application described herein shall be in the following form:—

6. The owner of any animal in respect of which an application for removal has been made in accordance with these Conditions or the agent of any such owner shall allow a Quarantine Officer to examine such animal at any reasonable time prior to the proposed removal and shall afford to the Quarantine Officer (Animals) every facility for conducting such examination.

7. The removal of any animal from one place to another place in the Territory of New Guinea is prohibited unless such removal is authorized by a Quarantine Officer (Animals).

8. Prior to the authorization of removal of any animal described in the preceding Condition a Quarantine Officer (Animals) may require such animal to be treated for disease or parasitic infestation or their prevention and any

such treatment shall be carried out by and at the expense of the owner of such animal under the supervision of the Quarantine Officer (Animals) provided that the Quarantine Officer (Animals) may cause such treatment to be carried out and recover the expenses thereof from the said owner and any expenses so incurred shall be a civil debt recoverable by proceedings in a District Court under the *District Courts Ordinance 1924-1938*.

9. A Permit for Removal of any animal may stipulate a condition as to specified treatment being administered to such animal at specified times and places in the course of such removal and if such a condition is imposed and not complied with the said permit shall be automatically cancelled and immediately become void and of no effect.

10. If any condition of removal of any animal imposed in the Permit for Removal is not complied with then such permit shall be immediately and automatically cancelled and become void and of no effect.

11. These conditions shall not apply to any animal moving or to be moved from one place in the Territory of New Guinea to another when such animal remains at all times during and after removal on the land of the owner of such animal or on land in which he has a right title or interest.

12. The Chief Quarantine Officer (Animals) aforesaid and any Officer of the Public Service of the Territory appointed by him in writing shall have under these Conditions the same powers and duties as Quarantine Officers (Animals).

13. In this Schedule the term "animal" includes any bull, cow, ox, calf, stallion, mare, gelding, foal, ass, mule, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, pig, goat, dog, poultry, or other animal or bird whatsoever.
