NOTICE⁽¹⁾

Town Boundaries Ordinance 1924-1927 of the Territory of New Guinea.

TOWN BOUNDARIES—LAE.

I JACK KEITH MURRAY, the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Town Boundaries Ordinance 1924-1927 of the Territory

of New Guinea and all other powers me enabling, do hereby declare Lae to be a town and do hereby set forth and declare the boundaries of the said town as set out in the Schedule hereto.

And I do further declare that the notice⁽²⁾ dated the 24th day of March, 1931, and published in the New Guinea Gazette dated the 31st day of March, 1931, defining the boundaries of the town of Lae to be revoked.

THE SCHEDULE.

All that area of land situated at Lae in the District of Morobe Territory of New Guinea commencing at the point of intersection of the meridian 146 degrees 58 minutes 36 seconds east longitude with the shore of Milford Haven at high-water mark and bounded thence on the west by the said meridian of east longitude north to a point 10 chains north of Markham Road thence on the north-west by a straight line north-easterly to the point of intersection of the parallel 6 degrees 41 minutes 30 seconds south latitude with the right bank of the Butibum (or Bumbu) River thence generally on the north-east by the said right bank of the Butibum (or Bumbu) River generally south-easterly to its junction with high-water mark on the shore of Huon Gulf and thence generally on the south by the said high-water mark generally westerly to the point of commencement.

Town Boundaries Ordinance 1924-1927 of the Territory of New Guinea.

BOUNDARIES OF TOWN OF MADANG.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Town Boundaries Ordinance 1924-1927 of the Territory of New Guinea, it is provided that the Administrator may by notice published in the New Guinea Gazette declare any place in the Territory to be a town and set forth and declare the boundaries of any town in the said Territory:

And whereas by notice⁽²⁾ dated the fifth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, published in the New Guinea Gazette dated the fifteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four the boundaries of the town of Madang were described:

And whereas by notice⁽³⁾ dated the thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one the boundaries of the town of Madang were amended:

PART C: TOWNS—

And whereas it is expedient that the said boundaries of the said town of Madang be further amended:

Now therefore, I, Jack Keith Murray, the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, in pursuance of the provisions of the Town Boundaries Ordinance 1924-1927 of the Territory of New Guinea and all other powers me enabling, hereby give notice and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be the town of Madang for the purpose of the said Ordinance.

THE SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point at high-water mark on the shore of Astrolabe Bay distant approximately 660 links south-easterly along the shore from the southernmost corner of Jakunda native land near Jakunda Point and bounded thence on the south-west by a straight line bearing magnetic 320 degrees 34 minutes for approximately 57 chains to the right bank of Jomba River thence generally on the north-west by the said right bank of Jomba River downstream to the shore of Binnen Harbour thence generally on the north north-west and west by the shore of Binnen Harbour on the north by the shore of Madang Harbour easterly to the northernmost point of Shering Peninsula and a straight line easterly to the northernmost point of Portion 67 thence generally on the north-east by the shore of Dallman Passage south-easterly to Cape Kusserow and by the shore of Astrolabe Bay south-westerly to the point of commencement.
