

# SALAMAUA PUBLIC BATHS RESERVE BY-LAWS.<sup>(1)</sup>

---

1. These By-laws may be cited as the *Salamaua Public Baths Reserve By-laws*.<sup>(1)</sup> Short title.

2. In these By-laws, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“adult male” means any male person of, or over, the age of eighteen years;

“financial member” means any member of the Salamaua Sports Club whose membership fee is not in arrears;

“reserve” means the land described in the Schedule to the proclamation<sup>(2)</sup> under section 72 of the *Land Ordinance 1922-1933*<sup>(3)</sup> dated the tenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four published in the *New Guinea Gazette* of the sixteenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four;

“subscriber” means the holder of a ticket issued by the Trustees, or by a person authorized in writing by the Trustees to receive fees, authorizing the entry of the holder into the reserve on the day or during the period specified in the ticket, and includes—

(a) a financial member of the Salamaua Sports Club;

(b) a female;

(c) a male other than an adult male;

(d) a visitor; and

(e) a resident of less than three months.

“Trustee” means a Trustee of the Salamaua Public Baths Reserve.

3. The charge for a ticket shall be— Charge.

(a) for three months, Ten shillings;

(b) for six months, Seventeen shillings and six pence;

(c) for one year, Thirty shillings.

4. A person shall not, without the consent of a Trustee, enter the reserve, unless he is a subscriber. Prohibition of entry to reserve.

The Trustees were appointed in, and the By-laws were made pursuant to a Proclamation, dated 10.4.1934 and published in *N.G. LAND—

Adequate costume to be worn.

5. Any person over the age of five years bathing, or being, within the reserve, shall be clad in a costume adequate to secure the observance of decency.

Penalty: One pound.

Power to order offenders to leave reserve.

6.—(1.) A Trustee, or any person authorized in writing by the Trustee to do so, or any European police officer, may order any person who behaves in an offensive or unseemly manner, or who contravenes any of the provisions of these By-laws, to leave the reserve.

(2.) Any person who refuses or neglects to obey an order given under this by-law shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Use of dressing shed.

7. The dressing shed or sheds within the reserve shall not be used for any purpose other than undressing and dressing.

Penalty: One pound.

Filth and rubbish.

8. A person shall not bring or deposit filth or rubbish within the reserve.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Damage to premises.

9. A person shall not damage, disfigure, or write upon, any fence, wall, dressing shed, or other structure within the reserve.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Prohibition of animals.

10. Any person who brings a dog, horse, or other animal within the reserve shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Two pounds.
