

POSTAL REGULATIONS 1928.⁽¹⁾

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Postal Regulations* 1928.⁽¹⁾ Short title.

2. The rates of commission chargeable for the issue of money orders shall be— Money orders, rates of commission.

(a) for money orders payable in the Territory, 6d. for each £5 or fraction thereof;

(b) for money orders payable in the Commonwealth of Australia, 3d. for each £1 or fraction thereof with a minimum of 6d.; and

(c) for money orders payable elsewhere, 4d. for each £1 or fraction thereof with a minimum of 9d.

(1) The *Postal Regulations* 1928 (made under the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance*, 1912-1916 (Papua, adopted) as amended by the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance* 1923) comprise the original *Postal Regulations* 1928, as amended by the other Regulation referred to in the following Table:—

(a) Each of these sets of Regulations stated in their respective introductory parts that they were "to come into operation forthwith." At the relevant dates in 1928-1931, Section 3(3) of the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance* 1923 provided that "all regulations made under this Ordinance or the Principal Ordinance shall be published in the *New Guinea Gazette* and shall take effect from the date of such publication or from a later date specified therein." The *Post and Telegraph Ordinance*, 1912-1916 (Papua, adopted) was, in the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance* 1923, referred to as "the Principal Ordinance." At the relevant dates in 1928-1931, there was no other Ordinance or regulation of general application providing for the publication of regulations, the date on which they were to take effect, or the meaning of "forthwith."
