WHEREAS by an Ordinance intituled the *Sago Ordinance*, 1908-1934, it is amongst other things enacted that the Lieutenant-Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, declare any Crown land to be a Sago Reserve:

And whereas by the said Ordinance it is further enacted that the Lieutenant-Governor may from time to time, by notice in the *Gazette*, extend the provisions of the said Ordinance to any indigenous tree or plant other than Sago and the said Ordinance shall thereupon be construed accordingly:

And whereas by notice under the said Ordinance dated the third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and published in *Gazette* No. 11 of the fifth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, the provisions of the said Ordinance were extended to *Kuru-kuru* grass:

Now, therefore, I, the Acting Lieutenant-Governor aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a Grass Reserve within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the said Territory, at Port Moresby, this sixteenth day of January, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and in the twenty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance intituled the *Sago Ordinance, 1908-1936*, it is amongst other things provided that the Lieutenant-Governor may by Proclamation in the *Gazette* declare any Crown land to be a Sago Reserve:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may from time to time by notice in the *Gazette* extend the provisions of the said Ordinance or any of them to any indigenous tree or plant other than sago:

And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and ten, published in *Gazette* No. 26 of the thirtieth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and ten, the provisions of the said Ordinance were extended to mangroves:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Ordinance do hereby proclaim and declare that so much of the area as is included in the boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be a Mangrove Reserve within the meaning of the said Ordinance.
