DECLARATION OF KLAMPUN WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA AND RULES AND APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF KLAMPUN WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

SCHEDULE 3

The Klampun Wildlife Management Rules are prepared and approved by the Wildlife Management Area Committee and endorsed by the Sulka Clan in recognition to the values of their tradition and customs.

All these underlying rules are the elements of effective management and operations of the said Wildlife Management Area:—

1. All visitors except the landowners and/or stakeholders may enter with "entry fees" to the committee or the appointee.
2. No entry is permitted to areas of "traditional taboo" and/or "Masalai Places". Additional visitors fees is levied upon entry to the places with guides including the burial sites at Klampun Village.
3. No clearing of any purpose is allowed in the traditional hunting grounds/forests of the Klampun Wildlife Management Area.
4. Clearing for gardens and family support activities are allowed on areas marked by the landowners and/or the WMA Committee away from the rivers for 50 metres and about 20 metres away from small streams.

Declaration of Klampun Wildlife Management Area and Rules and Appointment of Members of Klampun Wildlife Management Committee—continued

Schedule 3—continued

5. Restrictions or restorations on hunting areas/grounds may extended from six (6) months to two (2) years on parcels of forests considered to be breeding grounds for priced wildlife.
6. All diving glasses or goggles are prohibited in fishing or taking, karviet, smol, klak, ngmon etc. Any unlimited catching/taking of these fish can be allowed by the WMA Committee and/or stakeholders of Sulka Clan.
7. All juvenile fish and wildlife including pigs and megapodes are prohibited for killing or taking from Klampun Wildlife Management Area;
8. Taking or killing of female breeders i.e. pigs, megapodes is totally prohibited.
9. All fishing, catching and taking of fish and other priced wildlife following the underlying methods or items are totally prohibited.
 - (a) use of firearms and shot guns;
 - (b) dynamite or other explosive;
 - (c) gill nets;
 - (d) other dangerous substances, roots (native) and/or chemicals which are harmful to other life.
10. All making of fire near the rivers and stream is totally prohibited to avoid any destruction of the forest, food gardens and cash crops.
11. Burning of new garden areas is only allowed with one (1) meter cleaned boundary to ensure and avoid any over burning of forest, food gardens and cash crops.
12. Cutting of trees, burning of trees and the bush is prohibited on the seafront.
13. All waste not of forest, food garden or cash crop nature must be cleanly buried including man's feaces etc.
