CONSTITUTION

DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS

I, Sir Michael Thomas Somare, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, hereby:—

- (a) revoke the Determinations of the Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers dated 29th August, 2002 and published in the *National Gazette* No. G138 on 29th August, 2002 (as amended); and
- (b) determine that each Minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have:—
- (i) the title specified in Column 2;
 - (ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 3; and
 - (iii) the responsibilities for administering the Acts (or parts of the Acts) specified in Column 4, and set out opposite the name of the Minister (Schedule 1),
- to come into effect on and from the date of signature of this instrument.
