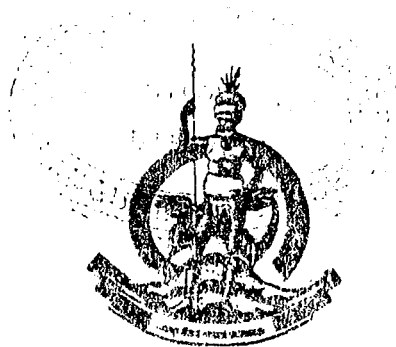

DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES
ORDER No. 6 OF 2000

To provide for the Forum Francophone des Affaires au Vanuatu to enjoy the privileges and immunities set out in Schedule 2 of the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act [CAP 143].

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section 5(a) of the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act [CAP 143], I make the following Order:


Privileges and immunities

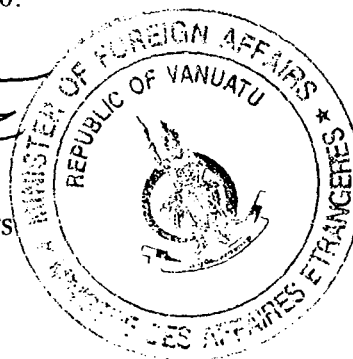
1. The Forum Francophone des Affaires au Vanuatu is to enjoy the privileges and immunities set out in Schedule 2 of the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities Act [CAP 143] and the legal capacities of a body corporate.

Commencement

2. This Order commences on the day on which it is published in the Gazette.

MUNICIPALITIES ACT [CAP. 126]

**LUGANVILLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL (PROHIBITION
OF DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AND COLLECTION
OF REFUSE) BY-LAW NO. 1 OF 1999**

To prohibit the indiscriminate disposal of refuse on any street side, road reserve, public park, public garden, public place, sewers, drains, culverts, dams or unoccupied land and private premises within the Luganville Municipal Council boundaries.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 36 of the Municipalities Act [CAP. 126] the Luganville Municipal Council hereby makes the following By-laws:-

INTERPRETATION

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires:

“Act” means the Municipalities Act [CAP. 126];

“Council” means the Luganville Municipal Council;

“owner or occupier” means a person or his agent or assignee who currently owns or resides on or takes care of a private plot of land or uses a private plot of land or resides on a private premises within the Luganville Municipal Council boundaries;

“premises” means public buildings, public land, public road, public street, public park, public garden, road reserved areas, sewers, drains, culverts, dams, unoccupied public areas, areas accessible to public at large and including private premises;

“refuse” means solid, semi-solid and liquid waste materials.

DISPOSAL OF REFUSE PROHIBITED

2. (1) It is unlawful to dispose or store any refuse on any premises within the whole of the Luganville Municipal Council boundaries.
- (2) Refuse derived from any private premises must be stored intact in a secured storage place within that premises pending collection by the Luganville Municipal Council refuse collectors.
- (3) Any refuse that is not for collection by the refuse collectors shall not be stored in the premises but shall be disposed of at the rubbish dump designated by the Council.

ESTABLISHMENT AND COLLECTION FEES

3. (1) There is hereby established a fee to be known as the refuse collection fee.
- (2) The Council shall levy a minimum refuse collection fee of VT1,500 per cubic meter of refuse collected from any private premises.
- (3) The owners or occupier of any premises or his agent or assignee must pay the said refuse collection fee prior to collection and disposal of his or her refuse by the Council.

REFUSE ON PRIVATE PREMISES MAY BE DISPOSED OF BY COUNCIL

4. (1) Where the Council is of the view that certain refuse on any premises must be removed and properly disposed of, the Council shall issue a notice to the owner or occupier of the said premises or his agent or assignee to remove the said refuse within a reasonable specified period.
- (2) If within the specified period the owner, occupier or his agent or assignee has failed to remove the said refuse the Council may remove the said refuse and shall charge a fee of VT20,000 for the removal of the refuse and any costs incurred thereto.
- (3) On having removed the refuse, the Council shall demand payment of the fee of VT20,000 and the costs from the occupier or owner of the premises or his agent or assignee within a reasonable period from the date of the demand.
- (4) If after the specified period, the outstanding fee of VT20,000 and costs remains unpaid, the Council shall be entitled to charge a further amount not exceeding VT5,000 per day in which the debt remains unpaid until payment.

- (5) Any charge payable under subsection (2) shall be a civil debt due to the Council from the owner or occupier of the premises or his agent or assignee and may be recovered by the Council in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

PROHIBITION OF DISPOSAL OF REFUSE ON PUBLIC PREMISES

5. (1) No person shall dispose of refuse on any public premises as defined in this By-law.
- (2) It shall be an offence against this By-law to dispose refuse on any premises punishable by a fine or imprisonment as set out under section 10 of this By-law.
- (3) Any refuse brought onto any public premises must be removed by the person who brought the said refuse on to or in the public premises or his agent or assignee as soon as practicable or must be removed within 2 months from the date of a notice from the Council to so remove the refuse.
- (4) Where any person fails to remove the refuse within the 2 months period, the Council may remove the refuse under the provisions of section 4 of this By-law.

DISPOSAL FEES

6. (1) There is hereby established a fee to be known as the disposal fee.
- (2) Any owner or occupier of any premises or his agent or assignee and any other person may collect and dispose his own refuse at the rubbish dump designated by the Council.
- (3) Subject to sub-paragraph (1) the owner or occupier of any private premises or his agent or assignee or any other person, organization or company must pay a disposal fee as contained in the Schedule attached hereto to the Council prior to such disposal.

BURNING OF REFUSE PROHIBITED

7. It is an offence against this By-law to burn, dispose or dump any refuse within the Municipal council boundaries other than at the dumping site designated by the Council.

POWER OF POLICE AND COUNCIL OFFICERS

- 8. Any police officer or an officer of the Council authorised by the Council in writing, may make enquiries to ascertain whether there has been any breaches of this By-law and in doing so, such officer shall have all powers as are accorded to him under the Act.

OFFENCE TO OBSTRUCT POLICE OR COUNCIL OFFICER

- 9. Any person who obstructs or impedes any police officer or any officer of the Council acting in the due exercise of his power pursuant to this By-law or who makes any false statement to any such officer whilst acting as aforesaid, or who refuses or fails without lawful excuse to cooperate with such officer shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a fine not exceeding VT20,000 or to 12 months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

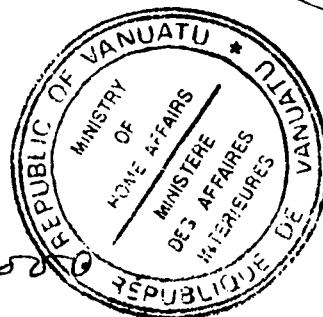
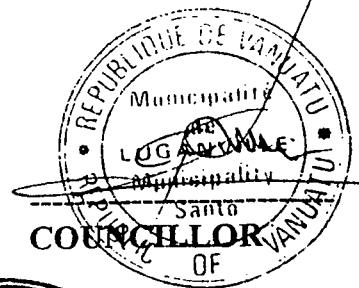
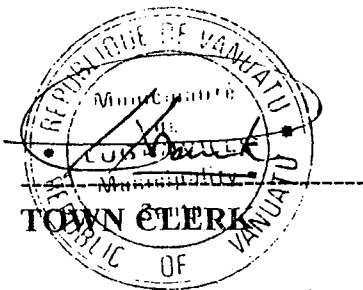
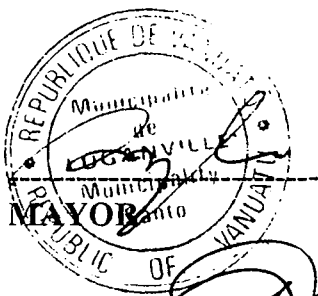
OFFENCE

- 10. Any person who breaches this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to fine not exceeding VT20,000 or for period of imprisonment not exceeding 12 months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

COMMENCEMENT

- 11. This By-law shall come into force on the date of publication in the Gazette.

2. Refuse by vehicles of over 3 tons
loading capacity VT 1000/trip

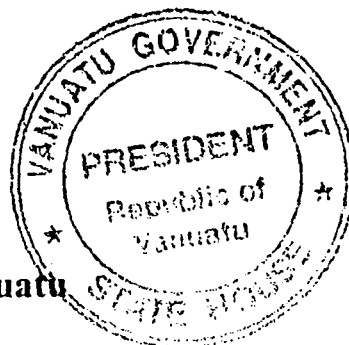
JEREMIAH SINGOMAT

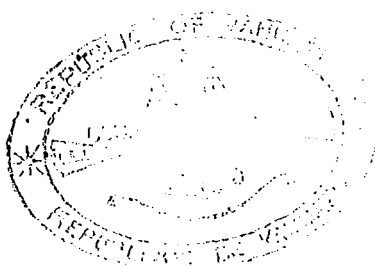
